#### Nomination Guidelines

National Philanthropy Day (NPD) is celebrated each year during the month of November to pay tribute to those who give of their time, talent and treasure to enhance and improve the quality of life in our local communities. The AFP Bluegrass Chapter in partnership with the University of Kentucky AFP Thoroughbred Collegiate Chapter invites your group to participate in National Philanthropy Day by nominating a student or student group for the 2011 Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award! The purpose of the Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award is to recognize a high school student and/or high school group/organization **who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to the community through direct financial support, development of charitable programs, volunteering, and/or leadership in philanthropy.** A committee comprised of AFP Bluegrass Chapter and AFP Thoroughbred Chapter will review nominations and choose the award recipient.

The Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award recipient/s will be honored **during the 25th National Philanthropy Day event to be held on Tuesday, November 8, at the Downtown Hilton in Lexington from 11:30 a.m. –1:30 p.m.** The honoree/s and a representative from the group will be honored during the lunch presentation. Others may also attend by purchasing additional tickets.

Please complete the attached nomination form. Submit the form along with a brief description of the work of the nominee and why the nominee is worthy of this recognition (not to exceed one page).

The following information should be addressed in the description:

- Description of what the nominee achieved, including goals, progression of work, a general budget, and others involvement (adult leaders or adviser).
- Description of the impact the nominee's project/s had on the community, including numbers of people involved, organizations helped, etc. Please include at least two references at the organizations who benefited from the nominee's work.
- Long term (1-2 years) impact of the nominee's work. Will the project/s be ongoing? What are the next steps?
- Evidence that the project/s can serve as a prototype for others or is easily replicable in other communities.

**ALL nominations must be received by Thursday, July 1, 2011.**
